Welcome to Mount Vernon!


Greetings! Welcome to the plantation home of America's first president. This beautiful house and grounds are located on the banks of the Potomac River in Virginia and bear witness to a ton of history which you can enjoy through this virtual tour.

There are many buttons to use to investigate the historic site!

You can look around using the mouse by clicking and dragging (same with trackpads). In addition, to zoom in / out, you can use the mouse wheel (or for trackpads, swipe down / up with two fingers) or use the controls in the lower left.



In the tour, you'll also see circles (information), arrows (to enter an area) and triangles (play videos)

Look to your left and go through the first door and into the Old Chamber.




6. What was the purpose of the Old Chamber?

Next, let's visit the Washington's' bedroom. To get there, first go back to the Study.




When you are in the Study, turn around so you can proceed to Washington's bed chamber upstairs.




